Veterans Service Officer's Message



Scams against veterans are on the rise. Pension poaching is a fraudulent scheme that targets Veterans, their families, and survivors who may be potentially eligible for VA benefits. Scammers often use the tactic of convincing you to buy a gift card, such as those from Google Play, Amazon, or Apple Card, and then provide them with the card number and PIN codes on the back. Unaccredited coaches or benefits counselors will guarantee a 100% rating from the VA, but only the VA can assess a benefits disability rating based on medical and service records. In addition, some educational

institutions and programs employ deceptive practices and make exaggerated promises regarding the value and earning potential of their degrees. Protect your benefits by only choosing G.I. Bill approved schools. See USVAVBA Bulletin for November 12-18 International Fraud Week for more information.

The American Flag should be flown at half staff on December 7, Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day. For flags that cannot be lowered such as those on many homes, a black ribbon or streamer should be attached to the top of the flag as an acceptable alternative. The ribbon should be the same width as a stripe on the flag and the same length as the flag. The black ribbons are available for purchase at the American Legion Emblem Sales website.
