As part of the base housing privatization process legislated by Public Law 104-106, the Defense Department states that when the number of vacant homes on any base rises above a certain level, the base contractor can rent them to anyone. ## Time Capsule - 81 Years Ago

Gene Autry, known as the "Singing Cowboy" was an American actor, musician, singer, composer, rodeo performer, and baseball club owner for more than three decades beginning in the early 1930s. He also was a pilot for the U.S. Army Air Force during WWII. Interestingly, Gene was the co-pilot on a New York to Los Angeles flight when two GIs were bumped from the passenger list so Elliott Roosevelt's dog Blaze could ride in their seats. Elliott was President Roosevelt's son and the incident created such a public outcry that Elliott nearly lost a promotion to Brigadier General. Autry enlisted in July 1942 as a Staff Seargent and spent most of WWII in the China-India-Burma (CBI) theater for the Air Transport Command. He was discharged in September 1945, one month after the war ended. ("WWII - 4129 Strange and Fascinating Facts by Don McCombs and Fred Worth", 1983)
